I like listening to the radio and TV for encouraging words. Listening to an Under Armour commercial, the announcer states, "The only way is through." However, in 2021, 74,717 households were served through pantries and meal sites. **Volunteers, staff, board members, and donors were able to distribute just over 3.3 million pounds of food.**

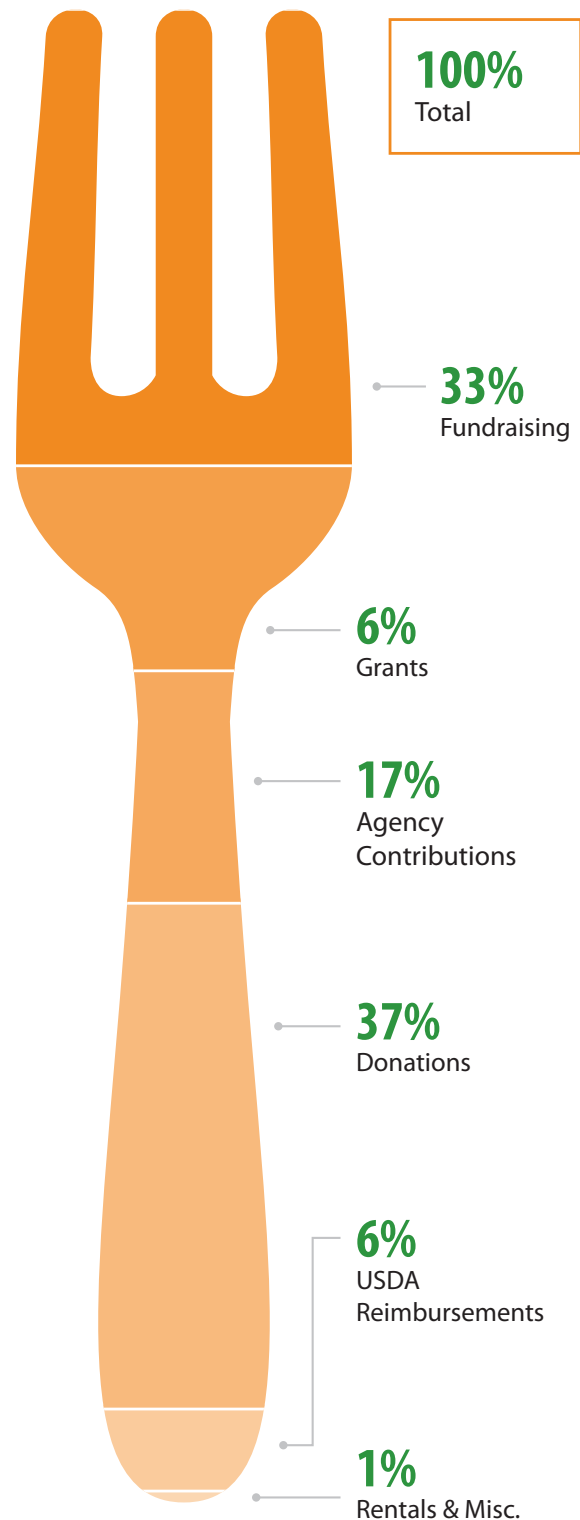

Agency Spotlight: *The Midtown Family Community Center*

A man travels on foot, behind the building and through the alley to get enough food for his family to last the weekend. An elderly woman, limited in her interactions with others, enjoys talking to others while sitting down for a hot meal.

This man and his family, this woman, and many others each month receive food from the Midtown Family Community Center (Midtown). Founded in 2007 as a project of the Jones Street Neighborhood Coalition, Midtown has served the Siouxland community for over a decade. Janet King, the Midtown Coordinator, and her team are hands-on when it comes to stopping by the Food Bank to pick up fresh produce, coordinating the delivery of food, preparing meals, distributing food for people to take home, and making people smile as they are served. The Food Bank receives many calls each month about the Midtown Mobile Food Pantry; anecdotal evidence that tells us people depend on and look forward to the food and meals provided by Midtown.

Whether people are driving through and taking food home from the mobile pantry or sitting down for a meal as a

community, Midtown serves approximately 2,500 adults and children each month — individuals and families of all sizes. They prepare and serve approximately 600 meals every Saturday, free to the public. During the holiday season, Midtown serves a Thanksgiving dinner and offers a Christmas program, complete with gifts. This last Christmas, over 300 kids received not only a warm meal but a present, too.

In addition to serving the community, you will also see Janet and others from Midtown volunteering their time at the Food Bank. As a pillar of service to the community with a mission to enhance the lives and futures of those they serve, Midtown's tireless effort to help those in need is to be admired.



Board Member Spotlight: *Ross Rocklin*

Born and raised in Sioux City, Ross Rocklin is the President of Rocklin Manufacturing, a family business based in Sioux City since 1934 that manufactures and distributes industrial electronic equipment.
